

LET heads to Evian for the 14th Evian Masters



This week the LET heads to the Evian Masters Golf Club in Evian-le-Bains, France, for the US\$3 million Evian Masters, which is the penultimate European major before The Solheim Cup in Sweden in September.

Defending champion Karrie Webb returns to the venue riding high in the Rolex World Rankings. The Australian has been in fine form, starting the year with home victories at the MFS Australian Open and the ANZ Ladies Masters. Last year, England's Laura Davies and 17-year-old American Michelle Wie tied for second in the tournament, finishing one shot off the lead. They will both be aiming to go one better.

The Evian Masters takes place from *Thursday 26-Sunday 29 July*, and is one of the highlights of the Ladies European Tour calendar. The course is situated at the foot of the Alps and is one of the most scenic courses on the Tour. *This year, the tournament will welcome 90 of the world's best players with a cut to the top 70 after two rounds.*

Solheim Cup Dream for England's Trish Johnson



Europe's leading lady Trish Johnson has spoken of her determination to play in the forthcoming Solheim Cup at Halmstad Golfklubb in Sweden. The matchplay tournament, which takes place from September 14-16, is widely regarded as the pinnacle event on the Ladies European Tour. Johnson is currently second in The European Solheim Team standings, behind France's Gwladys Nocera, and has a good chance of qualifying for Helen Alfredsson's European Team.

"I have always said that we play to make The Solheim Cup team, and to try and win it every couple of years," said the 41-year-old, who recently triumphed in the BMW Ladies Italian Open. "It is an

honour. You are representing the tour, you are representing Europe, and you are trying to beat the Americans at sport!"

Johnson also commented on her current position atop the New Star Money List: "Is there any pressure with being at the top? No: not at all. I love it," she said. "We're all out here trying to be at the top of the New Star Money List. If you are there then others want to catch you. If you're behind you've got to catch them. I am just going to try my best throughout the year to stay there."

"Brain Train" gets Martina back on track



Having a positive mental attitude is a fundamental part of playing golf, says German Martina Eberl. The 26-year-old, runner-up at last year's Ladies' English Open, said happy memories of the Chart Hills course helped her challenge for success in this year's tournament. "Good memories are a huge advantage," she said, after carding a five-under-par 67 in the first round.

"I go out there, have fun and am relaxed and talk about things other than golf with my caddy - that's the secret." Martina admitted disappointment at finishing the first nine holes on one-over-par, but five birdies on the back-nine put her within two shots of overnight leader Linda Wessberg. "I kept hanging in there and I was patient," she said. "I think that was something that pays off on this (Chart Hills) course and just accept it. Just keep going." Martina also revealed the identity of 'Brain Train' - a sports psychologist who has helped her focus in recent tournaments. "His name is Justin Walsh and I've been with them for three years now," she added. "Thankfully now it is paying off."

What's in the Bag? Emma Zackrisson



Sweden's Emma Zackrisson gave her golf bag a facelift for the latest LET event, the Ladies English Open, after deciding she had too many clubs for her own good. Emma swapped her three and five woods for a four wood, although she felt no need to change her MX500 one wood, from which she averages around 270 yards. "If I had to compare my clubs to a car, I would say they were like a Volvo or an Audi," said the 28-year-old, who joined the tour in 2002. "They are secure, I trust them, and it is like they have a turbo motor!" Her MX20 irons run from a four-iron through to pitching wedges of 51, 56 and 60 degrees. Emma says her bag contains nothing of particularly sentimental value, although her balls are marked with pink hearts and her C-Groove putter - complete with pink grip - has been given the name 'Natalie'. Other items in the bag include nuts and water, as well as notepaper containing tips from her coach. She also carries an MP3 player, featuring Swedish and American music along with "old stuff from the 80s".
