

## Records Tumble at Goteborg Masters



A fantastic week of golf at Lycke Golf club near Gothenburg, Sweden, produced two LET records. Nina Reis, who lives just 15 minutes from the course, carded a 61 during the final round to tie Kirsty Taylor's record for lowest round at a staggering 11 under par. The other, and equally impressive, record was the lowest four round score in the LET's 30 year history, a fantastic 29 under par from France's Gwladys Nocera. Gwladys, who has won nine events in the last three seasons, is looking to break into double figures this week at her home open at Arras, France.

## Linda Hopes for Back-to-Back Success

Linda Wessberg hopes to retain her title this week at the Védiorbis Open de France Dames in Arras. The 28 year old Swede is looking to improve what has been, in her own words, "a tough season". Last year, she beat Trish Johnson by a single shot in this event and she now wants to lift her game to take home the first prize of €52,500. The €350,000 event is the last full field event of the season and for many players it is their last chance to secure their cards for the 2009 season.



## Top of the Class head to Madrid



Next week's Madrid Ladies Masters has 40 of the best European golfers competing for the first prize of €100,000. Last year's winner, Martina Eberl of Germany hopes to defend the title and add another trophy to her cabinet this season having already won the BMW Ladies Italian Open and the Nykredit Masters in Denmark. The limited field €400,000 event hosted by Double Match marks the end of the 14 week European summer leg of the tour, after which, the players and caddies have a well earned break of just over 3 weeks before events in China, Korea and India. The final event of the season, the Dubai Ladies Masters, takes place just before Christmas and gives the players a chance to escape the European winter before going into the festive season.

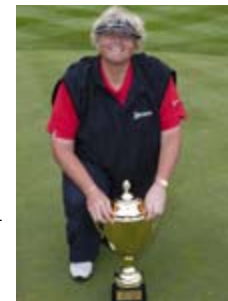
